Mission(活動の使命、組織の理念、活動方針など):

The mission that Mother Teresa founded was different than others in that it refused to engage in formal fundraising. Instead, the Missionaries of Charity both begged for food and money, and relied heavily on the money raised by word of mouth. Mother Teresa and her organization have been criticized by many for their lack of preventative, problem-solving programs. The people who criticize her believe that resources are more wisely used in to try and solve underlying problems so future people won't be affected by them. However, members of the mission stand firmly behind their policy of helping and comforting those dying or in pain right now; they believe the future will take care of itself. Today, helping the less fortunate is exactly what the mission is still doing. What started with little money and a handful of sisters has now become a worldwide organization with over seven thousand nuns and brothers, in over a hundred different countries. This organization is dedicated to helping the poor, unwanted, and sick of the world. Although Mother Teresa died in September, 1997, her organization plans to continue on for many years to come.

Key activities (機関の主な活動):

The Mother Teresa Center promotes authentic devotion to Blessed Teresa by:

- a) preparing and publishing the authentic writings of Mother Teresa;
- b) providing accurate information about Mother Teresa's life and activity, spirituality and message;
- c) publishing and distributing books and devotional materials (booklets, pamphlets, prayer cards, medals) in various languages;
- d) exhibitions and audio-visual presentations;
- e) talks, retreats, and missions for general audiences;
- f) collecting, preserving, and exhibiting Mother Teresa's genuine relics and articles of historical importance;
- g) Displaying creative works inspired by Mother Teresa (music, paintings, sculptures, writings, etc.);
- h) providing books and devotional material to the poor at no cost;
- i) Maintaining the official informational website.

The Mother Teresa Center is a non-profit organization established and directed by the Missionaries of Charity, the religious family founded by Blessed Teresa of Philippines, to be a unique and authoritative source of information on Mother Teresa. Its aim is to promote genuine devotion to Mother Teresa and authentic knowledge of her life, work, holiness, spirituality, and message and also to safeguard her words and image from misuse or abuse.
